

COLECCIÓN DE DESECHOS DOMÉSTICOS PELIGROSOS

- ♦ La Ciudad de Santa Maria tiene un Centro Colectivo de Desechos Domésticos Peligrosos en el Basurero Regional de Santa Maria. Este se encuentra localizado en 2065 E. Main Street, Santa Maria.
- ♦ El Centro Colectivo esta abierto cada Miércoles de 10:00 a.m. a 1:00 p.m. y cada Sábado de 9:00 a.m. a 3:00 p.m. No hay costo por la colección de desechos domésticos peligrosos.
- ♦ Los desechos que son colectados incluyen: aceite de motor usado. Filtros de aceite usados, anticongelante, limpiadores de hogar, pintura, y baterías.
- ♦ Los residents pueden transportar hasta **15 galones o 125 libras** de desechos domésticos peligrosos. Cantidades más grandes deberán ser traídas por un transportista certificado de desechos domésticos peligrosos. Una excepción es permitida para aceite de motor usado que no a sido contaminado, de el cual clientes pueden traer hasta 20 galones por visita en contenedores sellados de hasta 5 galones máximo.

SANTA MARIA RESIDENTS

The City of Santa Maria operates a Household Hazardous Waste Facility (HHWF) to help residents properly recycle or dispose of household hazardous waste. The HHWF is **free** for residents. Properly disposing of household hazardous waste is important to keeping the environment safe.

Items accepted at the HHWF include:

- ◆ Used motor oil
- ◆ Household cleaning products
- ◆ Used oil filters
- ◆ Paints - latex and oil based
- ◆ Antifreeze
- ◆ Batteries
- ◆ Pesticides
- ◆ Light bulbs

Residents may transport up to **15 gallons or 125 pounds** of household hazardous waste, with one exception – up to 20 gallons of uncontaminated used motor oil may be transported in 5-gallon containers (maximum) per visit. Amounts larger than this may only be transported by a certified hazardous waste hauler.

If your small business generates business hazardous waste, you may be able to recycle or dispose of the waste for a fee through the Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator (CESQG) program at the HHWF.

RECYCLE USED MOTOR OIL

Used motor oil is a common household hazardous waste that should **NEVER** be poured down the drain. It is extremely harmful to the environment. Recycle it at the HHWF.

Used motor oil is also accepted at many certified used oil collection sites in Santa Maria. View a list of other certified used oil collection sites at www.cityofsantamaria.org/utilities.

SUGGESTIONS FOR SELF-HAULING WASTE



**RECYCLE
USED OIL**

- ◆ Bring materials in their original container or in a secure, clearly labeled, leak-proof container.
- ◆ DO NOT mix different or unknown materials in the same container.
- ◆ Make sure lids are tight.
- ◆ Group similar products together to make unloading easier.
- ◆ Carry absorbent materials and a fire extinguisher.
- ◆ Store upright with secondary containment.
